



UNVEILING THE BEAUTY OF THIRUKOILUR

Jagadguru SriMan Madhwacharya Moola Maha Samsthana, Sri Uttaradi Matha is a significant Madhwa institution with various branches across BharataKhanda, that serves as a centre of spirituality, devotion, education and community activities.

INSIGHTS ABOUT THE THIRUKOILUR BRANCH:

Thirukoilur is a city in Tamil Nadu blessed by the presence of Sri Trivikrama Devaru. Along the banks of river Pinnakini/ Tenpennai in this city, lies the moola brindhavan of Sri Sri 1008 Sri Raghothama Teertharu and Sri Sri 1008 Sri Satyapramoda Teertharu.

ULAGALANDA PERUMAL SWAMY TEMPLE:

Ulagalanda Perumal or Sri Trivikrama Swamy is an avatara of Bhagwan Sri Vishnu. The temple, located at about 1.7 KM from the Math has rich historical, architectural, and spiritual significance. The temple also has Sri Durga Sannidhi on the right side of Sri Trivikrama Devaru in the same sanctum sanctorum.

SRI SRI 1008 SRI RAGHOTHAMA TEERTHARU:

Sri Raghothama Teertharu is a great pontiff of Sri Uttaradi Math who descended for the upliftment of satvic souls. Sri Raghothama Teertharu has the amsha of Ghatodgaja, the valiant son of Bheemasena Devaru. The brindavana of Sri Raghothama Teertharu is open to sky with no roof above the brindavan. There are huge trees just next to the brindavan, but their branches either burn out or are cut by monkeys when they try to grow above the brindavan. This can be seen even today.

His Early Life:

He received his basic studies in Nyaya Sudha and Vedantha from Adya Varadacharya and was blessed with poorna jnana by his guru Sri Raghuvarya Teertharu in a dream.

Sri Raghothama Teertharu authored the Bhavabhodas, which were written to bring out the nature and the hidden meanings of the works of Sriman Madhvacharya & Sri Jayatirtha. The five Bhavabhodas can be compared to five fragrant flowers of the parijata tree of Madhva Shastra, each exulting exotic fragrance soothing the satvik souls. The five Bhava Bodhas written by him are:

1. Brihadaranya Bhavabhoda
2. Nyaya Vivarana Bhavabhoda
3. Gitabhashya Bhavabhoda
4. Vishnutatvanirnaya Bhavabhoda
5. Tattvapraakashika Bhavabhoda

The bhavabhodas were first dedicated to Bhavabhoda Anjaneya and Paravasudeva in Srirangam before making the works public.

Sri Raghothama Teertharu and Sri Satyatma Teertharu are the only pontiffs of Sri Uttaradi Math to have taken Sanyasashrama as Brahmachari.

Moola Brindavana of Sri Satyapramoda Teertharu, Uttaradi Math, Tirukoilur

SRI SRI 1008 SRI SATYAPRAMODA TEERTHARU:

Sri Satyapramoda Teertharu is the 41st pontiff of Sri Uttaradi Math and the Guru of our current Pontiff - Sri Satyatma Teertharu. Shri Satya Pramoda Teertha was born to Rangacharya Guttal hailing from the village Guttal in Dharwad district of Karnataka in the year 1918 and was named Gururaj acharya. He took sanyashrama at a very young age (hardly 7 years into Grihastashrama). Sri Satya Pramoda Teertharu adorned this glorious peetha and did pooja for 50 years without a single day's interruption (1948-1997).

In his 50 years of Vedic reign besides every day Japa, Tapa, Sudha patha, Pravachana, he did 'VISHNU PANCHAKA VRATA' five times, and did 'KASHTA MOUNA VRATA' at Mahishi & Yaragola.

Under his great guidance hundreds of scholars (Pundits) who could teach 'Sudha' (Sudha Patha) were trained by him. They in turn are running 'GURU KULAS' (Sanskrit schools of Vedic Philosophy) propagating the Madhva Shastra & imparting basic knowledge of Sanskrit to young ones & Shastra Shrivana to the disciples (Grahastas) and 'Stree Dharma' to ladies etc.

He ordained Sanyas Ashram to Sarvagnachar and named him as 'Sri Satyatma Teertha' on 24-4-1996 at Thirukoilur (Tamil Nadu). This is where his Moola Brindhavana too exists. [Click here](#) to know more about Sri Satyapramoda Teertharu.

ABOUT THE BRANCH:

The branch of Sri Uttaradi Math at Thirukoilur is located at the banks of River Pinnakini/ Tenpenai. The Math premises has the presence of an Ashwatha Mara (Peepal Tree) and Sri Lakshminarasimha Swamy and Sri Anjaneya. The branch is at Manampoondi village, about 1.7 KM away from the famous Trivikrama Swamy Temple. There is a well on the premises for Bhavi Snana. Devotees come in large number in the weekends for darshan here while it is comparatively less crowded on the weekdays. It is an ancient tradition to do 3 days or 7 days of seva here, which is still followed.

ACCOMODATION & TEERTHAPRASADA

The Sri Math branch has good accommodation facilities with clean washrooms and bathrooms. Devotees are requested to book for accommodation in advance by contacting the math. Currently, an additional 24 rooms are being constructed to improve the accommodation facilities here and is intended to be inaugurated during the Aradhana Mahotsava this year (2025). There is ample parking space and the math has a good ambience.

LOCATION & HOW TO REACH:

- Thirukoilur can be reached by road. The popular routes are via Krishnagiri-Tiruvannamali from Bengaluru and via Villupuram from Chennai.
- Thirukoilur is well connected by Buses. The buses stop right in front of the Math.
- Devotees can travel by train also, as Thirukoilur has a railway junction (2 KM from the math).

NEARBY PLACES TO VISIT:



Sri Trivikrama Temple, Thirukoilur

- **Sri Trivikrama Swamy Temple (1.7 KM from math):** The temple is locally called Ulagalanda Perumal Swamy Temple and is dedicated to the Trivikrama Roopa of MahaVishnu. The temple also has the sannidhana of Sri Durga Devi in the inner sanctorum and is a must visit temple.



Parikkal Sri Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy

- **Parikkal Sri Lakshmi Narasimha Temple, Villupuram(32 KM from math):** Parikkal is a village which has an ancient temple for Lord Sri Lakshmi Narasimha. It is the family deity of many Madhwa families in Tamil Nadu and even border areas of Karnataka.



AdiRanga Temple, Adithiruvaram

- **Adi-Rangam Ranganatha Swamy Temple (18.6 KM from math) :** Located at about 20 kms from Thirukoilur is Adhi Thiruvaram, an almost unknown and yet, one of the oldest temples for Lord Ranganatha. This temple dates back to the first Yugam (Krita Yugam) and the first Avathaaram (Matsya Avathaaram). Hence, this Kshetram is referred to as 'Adhi' Rangam. Lord Ranganatha is seen in a gigantic east facing sleeping posture and measures over 15 feet. The temple is a big one and worth visiting.



Boovaraha Swamy Temple, Srimushnam

- **Boovaraha Swamy Temple, Srimushnam (92 KM from math):** The temple is one of the eight Svayamvyaktha Kshetras of Vishnu, the others being Srirangam, Tirumala, Naimisharanya, Pushkar, Badrinath, Tothadri and Saligramam.



Anthili Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy

• **Anthili Narasimha Temple(3.6 KM from Math):**

On the banks of Then Pennai River is the 1600 year old Lakshmi Narasimha temple in Anthili. It is said to be one of the four Narasimha temples in this region, the others being at Parikkal, Poovarasam Kuppam and Singagiri.




Thiruvannamalai Temple

• **Tiruvannamalai temple(37 KM from math):**

This temple is dedicated to Sri Arunachaleshwara and is considered as Agni Linga (one of the pancha bootha lingas). The temple was built about 1100 years ago. The temple has thousands of sculptures and 450 inscriptions. There are more than 100 shrines in this temple. The temple has idols, copper idols, paintings, beautiful Tiruchirappalli, Tirthakuls, Ayyarkal Mandapam, and sky-high towers.

This temple is very grand, spread over an area of 25 acres. The eastern Rajagopuram built by Krishnadevaraya is 217 feet high and is the second tallest tower in Tamil Nadu. Apart from these, the Valla Maharaja Gopuram, the Kalik Gopuram and the Ammani Amman Gopuram are important towers in history. The venerable Annamalaiyar Udanamar is the deity of this temple. The writing hall located on the mountain path serves as a painting gallery. Its rich architectural heritage and the presence of agni lingam puts it on the must visit list.



**Sri Satyanatha Teertha Moola Brindhavan ,
Veeracholapuram**

- **Sri Satyanatha Teerthara Moola Brindhavana, Veeracholapuram (13 KM from math):** Sri Satyanatha Teertha, before ordination as a sanyasi was known as Shri Narashimacharya. Shri Satyanatha Teertharu toured places, propagating Dwaita Philosophy. His works include Abhinava Chandrika, Abhinavaamruta and Abhinava Tandava. Contact number - 9486218256 / 6383604973.

- **Moola Brindavana of Sri Sankarshana Wodeyaru - Karaipoondi / Polur (71.7 KM from math):** Polur is within half an hour by road from Thiruvannamali and has ancient temple for **Sri Lakshminarasimha Swamy** on a hill. Karaipoondi is on the outskirts of Polur and has the moola brindavana of **Sri Sankarshana Wodeyaru** who took ashrama from Sri Satyaparayana Teertharu. He is famous for his Tippani on Harikathamruta Sara. **An Anjaneya Swamy sannadhi** is also next to the Brindavan.


A choultry with 2 rooms, toilet and a fresh water well are available for devotees to relax or even stay at Karaipoondi. But there is no permanent cook or achar here.

Satyavijaya Nagaram.**


- **Moola brindavana of Sri Satyavijaya Teertharu - Satyavijaya Nagaram (100 KM from math):** Sri Uttaradi Math at Satyavijaya Nagaram is on the outskirts of Arani and is at about 100 kms from Thirukoilur. At Satyavijaya Nagaram, moola brindavana of Sri Satyavijaya Teertharu, a mruthika brindavana of Sri Satyaveera Teertharu, moola brindavana of Ranga Wodeyaru, A divya sannidhana of Durita Nivarana Lakshminarasimha Swamy and mruthika brindavana of Rayaru are also there.
